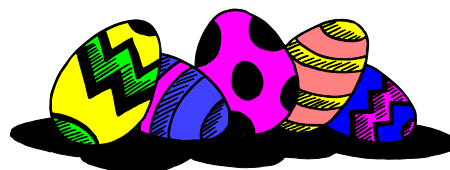
In the last couple of years, the Bike Shows have gone through some changes and are finally settling down to where they are more manageable.

THE LEADER AS MENTOR

The greatest need of both our generation and future generations is mentoring. Mentoring is like taking something old and something new and putting the two together. Mentoring is important to the success of GWRRA; it takes place at all levels, Chapter, District, Region and National.

Why is mentoring important? Many people do not understand the importance of mentoring, but its benefits are great. Mentoring affects both the mentor and the mentored. There is a sense of significance that happens. There is bonding that will last a long time and causes both people to find significance in each other. Mentoring expands and creates growth in the mentored. A mentor provides a model to follow, for example, at the Chapter level the Chapter Director is a mentor or role model to the Assistant Chapter Director. Mentors help you learn, reach your goals and help you to influence others. Mentoring is first of all, a process that comes about when someone who knows the ropes, for example the CD, is willing to teach them to someone else, like the ACD. Mentoring helps people grow, it doesn't happen through courses or a program; it happens through relationships. The leader who wants to mentor properly must build relationships.

The Marks of a quality mentor:

Be accessible – a leader must be accessible to followers.

Give wise counsel – offer practical suggestions and help with goal setting.

Give due recognition – give as much recognition as possible, praise often.

Reprimand as needed – as a mentor you won't always be a good guy, you will need to offer strong direction. Remember start with praise and end with praise.

Discipline if and when necessary – the meaning of the word discipline is 'to teach'. Discipline is not primarily punishment; it is there to restore, adjust and assist a person. Discipline exists to help people grow in the areas where growth is desperately needed and change is a necessity.

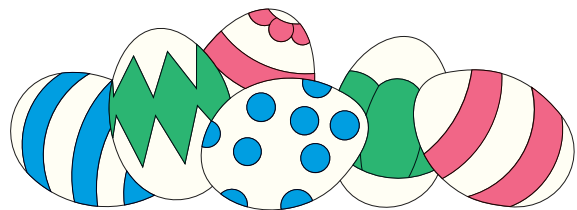
Customs Inspector at a border crossing! No one could top that! Rob & Tricia announced that they are already working on the COY basket for our District Rally in Killeen.

In addition to the TRC, being held Saturday, from 8:30 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. the following is a list of Rider Education activities.

10:00 to 12:00...Top Gun Practice (I will provide additional information on this event later in this letter.)

10:30 to 11:30... Motorcycle Crash Scene

Saturday:

7:00 to 8:00...Level IV Breakfast

8:30 to 12:30...First Aid/CPR Refresher Course

8:30 to 11:00...TRC Classroom

12:00 to 4:00...TRC Range (*Proper riding equipment required)

10:00 to 11:00...Co-Rider Seminar

10:00 to 12:00...Top Gun Challenge

2:00 to 3:00...Motorcycle Crash Scene

There is still a need for qualified instructors to teach the First-Aid/CPR, (both 1st and refresher course), Co-Rider Seminar, PLP facilitator for the classroom and range, and assistance for the classroom and range activities of the TRC. The host site will also be providing oversight and supervision for the “Top Gun Competition.”

*Proper riding equipment for all range activities is as follows:

- 1) DOT approved helmet
- 2) Long sleeve shirt or jacket
- 3) Long pants
- 4) Over the ankle foot wear (leather boots preferred)
- 5) Full fingered gloves
- 6) Eye protection (if shields are used, they must be lowered and windshields are **not** considered adequate eye protection)

Back by popular demand is the Top Gun Challenge, which emphasizes skills necessary in riding effectively in many street situations...our combat zone. Thus the Top Gun program was developed to:

- 1) Increase survivability on the road through practice of defensive/evasive riding techniques in a controlled environment
- 2) Provide for the fun of competition with fellow riders of similar capabilities and earn the designation as "Top Gun" at a District, Region, or International level.

The "Top Gun Challenge" uses a professionally developed riding course comprised of nine exercises to challenge individual riders in demonstrating their riding skills. Proper execution of riding maneuvers and, in limited instances, time to complete the exercises is considered in determining point totals.

Additional information about the "Top Gun Competition" can be found on the attached PFD document. (Note: The above information has also been extracted from the Top Gun material.)

Remember, GWRRA is for Fun, Safety, and Knowledge and knowledge is part of the continued education that will allow all "Wingers" to remain safe.

IRS and GWRRA

Hopefully by now all you new Chapter Directors have filed your 8822 forms to change the address of your chapter to your address. The forms can be found at www.irs.gov.

Also all chapters must file annually file Form 990 with the IRS. All chapters are subordinates of GWRRA, Inc. Chapters, Districts and Regions are affiliates of GWRRA, Inc. but we are separate. The sole purpose of the relationship is to allow affiliates to receive not-for-profit tax treatment on various activities if they choose to take advantage of it. GWRRA, Inc. has its own organizational documents, not for use by affiliate.

E-Postcard Form 990-N

The IRS requires that the e-Postcard (Form 990-N) must be filed annually by all subordinates (Chapters, Districts, and Regions) of GWRRA whose gross receipts are \$25,000 or less for the tax year. Your tax year must have ended before you can file an e-Postcard. It is absolutely necessary that the e-Postcard be filed with the IRS. Failure to do so can cause penalties and fines or even the loss of GWRRA's subordinates not-for-profit status.

It is the responsibility of the Officer to be sure this form is filed on-line by May 15 of each year. However, it may be filed by the Assistant Chapter Director or the Treasurer under the direction of the Chapter Director.

To access the e-Postcard site go to <http://epostcard.form990.org>. Once

there, you will need to complete a three-step process:

1. Register as a new user. If you have filed in the past, go to step 2. You will be assigned a login ID based on your EIN. The first login ID will be your EIN plus the number 01. You can have more than one login ID to allow others to access the site. Subsequent IDs will be 02, 03, and so on.

2. Create the Form 990-N (e-Postcard)

3. Submit your Form 990-N (e-Postcard)

E-Postcard Rejection

If your e-Postcard is rejected, there is an explanation on the screen as to why it was not accepted. It could be you entered the EIN incorrectly, or the EIN you entered does not belong to your Chapter. Double check your entry to be sure it is correct. You can call the Home Office to verify the EIN they have on file for your Chapter.

Another reason for rejection may be that you are not recognized as a subordinate of GWRRA. This is likely due to Form 8822 (Address Change) not being filed with the IRS when the new Officer was instated. It is extremely important that all incoming Officers fill out this form and mail it to the IRS as soon as possible. This form may be obtained at www.irs.gov.

Information Needed to File the e-Postcard

1. Your Employer Identification Number (EIN) sometimes known as

a Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN).

2. The tax year.

3. Legal name and mailing address. Example: Chapter AZ-A; District AZ; Region F

4. Name and address of a principal Officer. (The Chapter, District, or Region Director)

5. Website address if the subordinate has one.

6. Confirmation that the subordinate's annual gross receipts are normally \$25,000 or less.
