RIDER EDUCATION UPDATE

Friends, can you believe that October has already arrived. This starts the second busiest season of the year for my family. Besides all the usual birthdays and anniversaries Suzanne and I are gearing up for the Rider Education Events that are coming up. Allow me to review them:

First we have the Education Weekend that will be taking place at the East Texas Baptist University Campus in Marshall, Texas on October 17th-18th. We are offering the usual core seminars as well as the MFA Refresher Course. We are also offering the TRC and ARC Riding Courses. As I write this article the ARC is in jeopardy of being cancelled. By the time you are reading this article that decision will have been made. So, check the District Website for the latest information on that. The reason we may cancel the ARC is due to a lack of members signing up for it. At this moment, we have 1 person signed up. Considering the time, effort, and material to paint the ARC range we really need at least 5 members taking the course to make it feasible. The TRC is doing well, but we still have a few spots available.

The next event is our Mid-Winter Round Up which will be held at the convention center in Killeen, Texas. This will also be the site of our 2010 Texas District Rally. At the Mid-Winter Round Up Suzanne and I will be doing a Breakout session for Rider Educators. We will be reviewing and explaining the paperwork that the Educators need to be familiar with. We will also be reviewing our National Rider Education Database and how to use it. Since we have so many new Educators in Texas, it is our hope that everyone attends. At the MWRU we will also be recognizing our Educator of the Year, and the Rider Education Article of the Year.

What is the Article of the Year and Educator of the Year Recognition all about you ask. Simple. Educators must submit one of their articles published in a Chapter Newsletter. This article should be informative and educational and therefore enhancing Rider Safety. Only one article from each Educator will be accepted. That's all that is involved to be in the running for Article of the Year. The article must be submitted either by e-mail or snail mail by November 1st. To be considered for Educator of the Year the Chapter Educator must be nominated by their Chapter Director. Directors must seriously consider if their Educator has gone above and beyond the call of duty. Educators have a certain amount of expectations placed on them when the Position was accepted. Fulfillment of these basic duties does not earn someone a nomination. We are looking for those individuals who have really made a commitment of time, energy, and resources to provide their Chapter with exceptional educational opportunities. Chapter Directors, if you have such an Educator on your staff we look forward to hearing from you. Send us your letters by November 1st describing why your Educator is the Educator of the Year.

The next event after our Mid-Winter Round Up will be the 2010 Texas District Rally in Killeen, Texas. I will only go into one detail at this time about our Rally. The Level IV Breakfast will gather at the Convention Center and ride together to Fort Hood for a good breakfast on base. Some prior military personnel may remember these facilities as "Mess Halls". Trust me these are state of the art facilities with dedicated personnel that will feed you well. With that being said there are a few rules we must observe to get on base. I will be reviewing these several times between now and May because they are important and not flexible.

To drive on a military reservation is a privilege permitted by the Base Commander. He has certain Protocol to observe. I will list the requirements and a brief description.

- You must have a motorcycle endorsement on your license to operate a motorcycle on a Military Reservation. This is self-explanatory.
- You must wear full safety gear: long pants, long sleeves, helmet, and full fingered gloves, eye protection, and boots or shoes that cover the ankles. Nothing new there. This is our normal gear every time we go on a riding course range. Hopefully, this is what you wear every time you mount up.
- In addition to the normal gear mentioned above, you will be required to wear a reflective outer wear of some sort. Reflective jacket or vest. Jackets with reflective piping do not meet this requirement if I understood correctly. I will verify that in future months but wanted to give everyone a head's up on this.
- Also, in the area of eye protection there is a little new twist. We are used to being required to wear eye protection. But, the government is particular and should not be a problem as most of us wear helmets with face shields. Just be aware that eyeglasses, prescription or sunshades, don't count as eye protection. Neither does windshields or fairings. You will be required to wear a face shield in the down position, safety glasses, goggles, or wrap around glasses to ride on Fort Hood.

I believe you will agree with me all these restrictions are reasonable and livable. We meet most of those requirements every time we get on our bikes. So, let's get together and ride out to our nation's largest Military Base and enjoy some good food and fellowship. Suzanne and I look forward to seeing each of our Level IV's there. And this is a good place to clear up some confusion about the Level IV Breakfast.

Any member that has met the requirements and submitted a Level IV Application is eligible and welcome at the Breakfast. The Level IV Breakfast is about the persons that have made the time and monetary sacrifices to go the extra mile for rider safety within GWRRA. This is for our elite riders. Our Master Tour Riders. And it is not an easy Level to attain. It takes years and loads of training on and off the motorcycle. And it takes patience. Yep, some of you know where I am going with this.

- After you have spent the time and money to become safer, more knowledgeable riders and submit your Level IV Application the patience part comes in. I know it is hard and I wish I could do something about the procedure, but it is above my pay grade. Seriously, the procedure is a bit lengthy but necessary to preserve the integrity of the Rider Education Program. After you as a member gets together with your Chapter Educator and fill out the Application here is what happens.

Your Chapter Educator mails it to the District Educator that would be Suzanne and I in Texas. We check the member on the Database for eligibility. Then we check the Application for accuracy. Then we check that the money sent is appropriate and that the check is made out to the proper people. In the case of a Level IV Application the check should be made out to GWRRA National. A mistake in eligibility or paper-

work will delay your request because the mistake will have to be corrected before being submitted to our Regional Educators for the next step. By the way, the two biggest mistakes being made by the Chapter Educators is sending the Application in early and making the check out to the Texas District.

After your application clears our desk we send it on to John and Lydia Bourg our Regional Educators. They second check me and then sign off on the Application and send it on to Phoenix. In Phoenix after processing the paperwork you are assigned your personal Master Tour Number and a request is sent in on your behalf for the patches. Then the Patches are made and sent back to Phoenix who then sends the package back down the line until it reaches the correct District Educator. If your District Educator can find a District Staff member to make the presentation you will receive your Patches at the next Chapter Gathering. If we are unable to find an available District Staff member your package is mailed to your Chapter Educator. By the way, all the times I mentioned mail that is snail mail because we need your original signature, no electronic shortcuts here. That involves a lot of delays.

I have been hearing from upset members who are growing tired of waiting. And we emphasize with you and know firsthand where you are coming from. Every Level IV had a tiresome delay. Suzanne and I waited for about four months. And as stated earlier this is not due to anyone's fault. It is a precise and tedious procedure to ensure that when you receive that Level IV Patch it really has significance. The only exception to the procedure outlined above is if you ordered the Black/Gold Patch. That Patch comes from an outside source and is usually mailed directly to the member. In this case the member receives his/her patch about the same time the District Educator receives the official package from Phoenix.

We hope that everyone feels a bit more informed on the upcoming Rider Education Events and have answered a few questions. If you have any questions, concerns, or comments please feel free to ask us anything at anytime. We are here to serve you the Texas District members, but we can't do that properly if we don't know what is on your minds. Our e-mail addresses and phone number is on the website. E-mail is probably the easiest way to reach us because I work nights. Either way, Suzanne and I will try to get you a timely response.

Thanks for caring enough about Rider Education to read this lengthy article. We look forward to seeing you in Marshall.

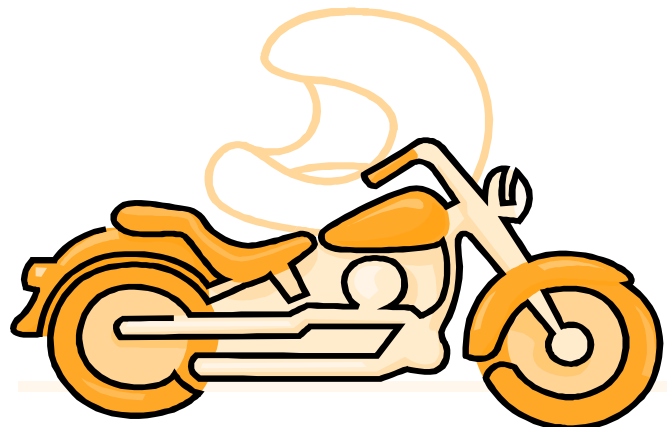

HOW A NEW GWRRA CHAPTER IS ORGANIZED

The Proactive Approach to Chapter Formation

PHASE 4: First Informational Meeting

- The first meeting is crucial. Make everyone feel welcome. Thank everyone for taking their time to attend the meeting. Provide a sign-in sheet for all attendees. (<http://med.gwrri.org/guides/Proactive%20Approach.pdf>)
- The facilitator should get everyone talking by asking them to give their name, city, bike information, or anything else that will help put everyone at ease with the other attendees.

- Topics of conversation should include Chapter fun, activities, staff requirements and positions, newsletters, funds, and even more fun activities. Fully-informed people are more likely to get excited about a new idea.
- Always welcome questions. Questions usually lead to the person who will be interested in becoming Chapter Director. Give a copy of “What is Expected of a Chapter Director” (<http://med.gwrro.org/guides/Proactive%20Approach.pdf>) to anyone that has an interest in becoming a Chapter Director.
- A favorable response and attendance will prompt the announcement of the second meeting to be held in one month. The facilitator may even try to organize a ride (dinner or short trip) before the next meeting.
- Make sure everything has a positive note. Everyone should be thanked again for attending. Never make the statement “I wish we had a bigger turnout,” since that statement is a real slap in the face to those that took the time to attend.
- A statement needs to be made that the District will support up to three meetings. By that time, someone will have to step forward to become Chapter Director and take over the monthly gatherings. “The Chapter belongs to the Participants, not the District.”

PHASE 5: Set up Second Meeting

•The District Membership Enhancement Coordinator reports the outcome of meeting to District Director, then sends out a letter to everyone on the list giving results of first meeting and inviting them to the second meeting (<http://med.gwrro.org/guides/Proactive%20Approach.pdf>) Same actions are taken for the third meeting. **FOOTNOTE:** Goals of the Meetings The goals of the three meetings are to be informational in nature, providing information regarding GWRRA Chapter formation and Chapter life. The group will become a Chapter before they know it. Don’t be afraid to repeat information at each meeting to educate new attendees. All that is left is a Chapter Director to pull it all together, and it must be the right person to make it all work. It is the responsibility of the District Director to appoint the Chapter Director. Anyone showing interest should be noted for the District Director to contact. No one should be told they have the position until appointed by the District Director and approved by the Region Director. The Proactive Approach is a proven method of fostering new Chapters. If you have areas with GWRRA Members and no Chapters, give this a try. It is a “Win-Win” proposition: the new Chapter and Participants, the District, Region and GWRRA Organization.

BY THE BOOK

The following article should not only apply to new members and former members but also former officers who feel they are “owed”. The content below can be found in the **Officer Guide Book** on page D-13 and D-14.

THE PHANTOM MEMBERS (Sometimes called “Hitch-hikers”)

After 30 years of successful growth, GWRRA has caused a peculiar phenomenon. We caused it by being TOO friendly! An explanation is in order. We have always understood that GWRRA’s organization and its benefits are exclusively for its Members. However, our meetings, and many times our events, have always been for Members and their guests. Obviously, we do this to give potential Members a chance to look us over and, hopefully, they will join our family. Our friendliness also extends to former Members; much to our credit... again hoping they will re-join our family. However, and this may be hard to believe, there seem to be some folks who see no reason to rejoin us. Not because they don’t like us, but because they have seen the FUN we have, is an “open door and they don’t feel that “Membership” is necessary to take advantage of these important benefits. We all know that two of our most important benefits are namely, the Chapter and the wealth of activities that constantly go on within GWRRA. Some of these Phantom “Members” have friends who give them old copies of *Wing World* magazines and sometimes an old Gold Book for when they travel. Many dues-paying Members ask, “Aren’t we being too kind?” Many wonder how some of these folks can see no reason to REALLY belong to

GWRRA. They also wonder why a Phantom Member takes free what others are paying for. Understand, we are not talking about our guests here, we’re talking about those who once were part of us and now (for whatever reason) are not. Yet they continue to participate in the fellowship and friendship of something that was created for “Members Only”. We know that many of our Officers do not believe they have this problem. If so, that is good for you, your participants and GWRRA. However, if you’re like some, there could be as much as 33% of your Chapter that are phantoms. Be aware, that if this trend continues, your Chapter will eventually cease to be, and a Club will be born. Here is our dilemma. We don’t want to be “snobbish” or rude, but we need to help these folks understand the reasons and advantages of true Membership in our family. They need to understand the difference between Membership, friend or guest. Several Chapter Directors have dealt with their problem through the Phantom’s wallet i.e. most Chapter events use “sign-in” sheets (<http://www.gwrro.org/oconnect/documents>). All participants show their GWRRA Membership Card. The expiration date can usually be verified. No card? That’s okay, BUT coffee, pie, 50/50 tickets, etc. etc. Maybe you could have a surcharge for all “non-Members.” Perhaps you could have a supply of paper name tags saying, “Hi - I’m XXXX, a visitor”. This would serve two purposes: 1) identify the guest (or the former Member) for special get-acquainted-type actions or friend-making, and 2) help them understand how special Membership in GWRRA really is. We suggest allowing non-members to attend three gatherings before joining. All our events already charge a different price for non-Members, if for no other reason, to identify the benefits of GWRRA Membership and because GWRRA activities are primarily for GWRRA Members. We’re not suggesting that money is the answer or even the proper tactic. Some have used these methods with a certain degree of effectiveness. Obviously, there are other things that can be done to help us regain our

Members. Maybe you will have to delve more deeply into why they have chosen to alienate themselves from us and see if there is something we can do to make them feel better about GWRRA. Many times you will find that miscommunication is the prime difficulty. As already stated, if this is not a concern for you, then continue your path of success. If this is starting to be a problem, then be alert for these phantoms - be diplomatic - be kind. If necessary, you may have to limit their “activities” with us, but don’t let these folks “steal” (so to speak) that which is only for

our GWRRA family. If you need more ideas or have other concerns, talk it over with your appointing Officer or your staff. In any case, ALWAYS try to find the Win-Win answer.

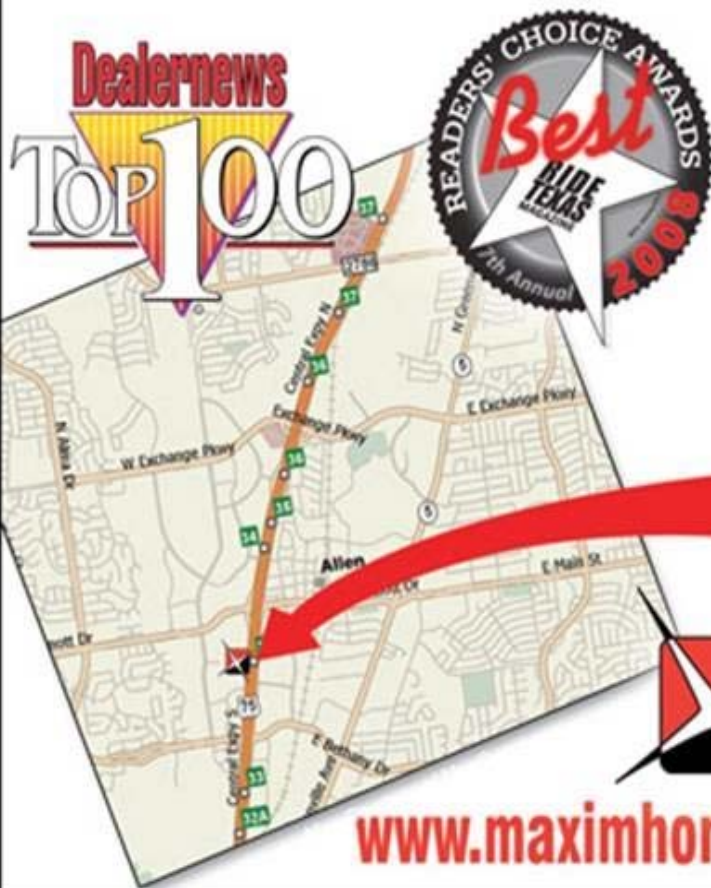
